







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It was a hot August morning in the Bronx, New York, in 1984. A tall, thin man walked quickly down St. Ann's Avenue. His name was Stephen Ritz. He was hurrying to his first teaching job at South Bronx High School. He was only 21 years old.

At first, Stephen's students didn't trust him. On his first day, he asked a student named Vanessa to sit down. "What do you know about what we go through?" she asked. "You're here to get paid. Go home!" But Stephen didn't go home. Instead, he shared his lunch with Vanessa. The two became lifelong friends. This was the first step on a journey that would transform Stephen into a teacher like no other.

The Bronx 15 Home

Stephen Ritz was born and raised in the Bronx. When he was young, Stephen learned to interact with **diverse** people and points of view. "There is no place on Earth like the Bronx," said Stephen. "My friends' families were Irish, Italian, Jewish, and African," he said. In the Bronx, Stephen learned the importance of **teamwork**. Whenever Stephen or his friends needed help or advice, there was always someone who could lend them a hand.

The Bronx was also where Stephen went to elementary school. Stephen didn't get very good grades. "For me, school wasn't just about my classes," Stephen said. Stephen loved to learn, but didn't always like the way he was being taught. He also loved to play basketball. School, parks, and **community centers** were Stephen's favorite places.

diverse: made up of many different types of people

teamwork: the working together of a group of people in order to achieve something **community center:** a place where people can gather for activities

Stephen didn't enjoy **academics**. This later helped him become an **innovator**. He became the kind of teacher who could change students' lives.

academics: the classes taken at school or in college

innovator: someone who uses a new idea or method of doing something



Ask for Help


Asking for help takes courage. Growing up in the Bronx, Stephen and his friends relied on their community for support, ideas, and supplies.

After college, Stephen wanted to play professional basketball. When he hurt his knee, he had to stop playing. Instead, he became a teacher in the Bronx. He loved the job. He shared hip-hop, snacks, and personal stories with students. This helped him to "connect with students and kept them coming to class," he said. Students like Vanessa began to respect him.

Stephen asked his friends for help with his science class. One morning, he received a box. It was

filled with what looked like moldy onions. Disappointed, he hid them behind a radiator in his classroom. Six weeks later, daffodils were growing in the box!

The flowers **inspired** Stephen and his students. They planted thousands of flowers around New York City. They also started a group called Green Teens.
